**Aim of Activity \***

To address the current lack of timely access to rehabilitation and withdrawal services, particularly in regional and rural areas, and also including access to innovative and less intensive models of care for both residential and non-residential services. SENSW PHN aims to encourage management in the community and improve overall care-coordination across the region, including early intervention, counselling, case management, after-care services and relapse prevention support.

**Description of Activity \***

SENSW PHN will continue to commission services that span early intervention and enhance services access for priority populations and individuals at risk through to a more intensive case management approach. These services are for people with a higher level of substance use and more complex needs, with access to withdrawal, rehabilitation and after-care services, as required. The

stepped-care case management model provides community based, residential and non-residential alcohol and other drug treatment services.

The intensity of support is tailored to the person's current needs and stage of recovery and will be flexible over time. Support can be stepped down in the recovery maintenance phase, with the capacity to promptly step-up support if the need arises. The commissioned services operate with a hub-and-spoke approach across rural and regional areas within the PHN catchment.

The Mobile Alcohol and Drug Day Rehabilitation service is now fully funded under alternate funding arrangements through the Community Grants Hub grant agreement until 30 June 2026.

SENSW PHN aims to encourage management in the community and improve overall care-coordination across the region, including early intervention, counselling, case management, after-care services and relapse prevention support.

**Description of Activity \***

SENSW PHN will continue to commission services that provide culturally safe and effective AOD treatments and early interventions for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people and adults.

These services are flexible and tailored to the needs of individuals. The activity will optimize the use of available services in the region and strengthen links with broader health and community services (including mental health services, child, youth and family services), to provide holistic care for individuals and families.

Continuing services will provide:

- increased access to treatment services for Aboriginal women, including women with children and Aboriginal men, across the entire PHN region, via a brokerage model,
- increased access to drug and alcohol services for Aboriginal people in mainstream services

To ensure that services transitioned to SENSW PHN for management continue to operate efficiently and effectively; to increase access to day rehabilitation programs in areas of the SENSW PHN catchment which have particularly high need, including a large proportion of people identifying as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander.

**Description of Activity \***

SENSW PHN will continue to commission service providers to offer appropriate AOD treatment and support for priority populations and people with complex needs, in a community setting. These services provide assessment, referral, case management, counselling, withdrawal, recovery and relapse prevention programs and engage with clients on a one-to-one basis or in groups.
