Description of Activity *

This activity involved the contracting of various providers working with vulnerable and priority populations to improve primary care engagement and importantly vaccine uptake. Providers were working with population groups including those who were homeless or sleeping rough, culturally and linguistically diverse populations including refugees, Aboriginal and Torres Strait

Islander communities, families and individuals experiencing socioeconomic disadvantage, disadvantaged youth, rural communities, and young people with AOD and/or mental health concerns.

The holistic approach targeted improved primary care linkage and better engagement with preventative healthcare including COVID vaccination. This was achieved through provider education, community outreach, health promotion strategies and direct clinical service delivery to engage with those at risk of under-vaccination and/or experiencing access barriers to primary healthcare.

1,010 vaccinations provided to vulnerable people in the 2024/25 FY, 4 of which were non-Medicare card holders and 183 of which were homebound individuals.

Additionally, 68 registered nurses (38 in General Practice and 30 in Aged Care) upskilled to become authorised Nurse Immunisers and participated in training to support addressing vaccine hesitancy.

To strengthen the role PHNs play in commissioning multidisciplinary health care teams.

Description of Activity *

SENSW PHN will commission a multidisciplinary team approach in the PHN region by identifying and consulting with small or solo general practices and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services that lack access to such teams through other funding streams.

Our approach will prioritise areas of need in underserved or financially disadvantaged communities, such as managing chronic conditions, coordinating care for priority patients, and providing social support for at-risk individuals.

Commissioning multidisciplinary teams will aim to address these needs, expanding SENSWPHN's role in supporting allied health, nursing, and midwifery practices, and establishing reporting processes with data collection to monitor and adjust implementation as needed.

The **Healthy Hearts Healthy Minds** program will be delivered in selected GP practices to optimise care and improve health outcomes for patients at risk of CVD. It will operate over two years from 2025-26 to 2026-27. The Program will be delivered by a nurse-led multi-disciplinary team (MDT) of Registered Nurses (RNs), General Practitioners (GPs), GP practice staff, and brokered

Allied Health professionals. Nine GP practices in South-Eastern NSW have been selected for the initial rollout of this program. Up to 11 more practices may be selected in a further round dependent on demand for the program.

Practice support will be informed by the National PHN Allied Health in Primary Care Engagement Framework and underpinned by the National Allied Health Engagement Toolkit. Activities will include engagement, training and education, service mapping, information sharing and capacity building against six areas: improving sector governance and culture across the PHN; relationship building and communication with the sector; digital health adoption; commissioning allied health workforce more effectively; and implementation of integrated care models.

Description of Activity *

Through ongoing engagement with general practices, SENSW PHN identified opportunities to strengthen multidisciplinary care models via interprofessional education and collaborative practice. Following an open expression of interest, selected practices will implement small-scale team-based learning activities between June and November 2025. These initiatives aim to enhance care models and improve patient outcomes through collaboration.

To extend support more broadly, SENSW PHN has partnered with the Australian Primary Health Care Nurses Association (APNA) to develop a tailored multidisciplinary learning program that addresses population health needs. The program includes webinars and supplementary resources, scheduled for release between August and December 2025.

These activities were informed by extensive consultation with practices on optimal utilisation of WIP-PS to enhance existing care models. The bespoke program was not ready for a June release, however our collaboration with APNA ensures its rollout in the latter half of 2025. The initiative is designed to uplift team capability, strengthen disease management, and improve health outcomes through an integrated, collaborative approach.

To identify and assist unaccredited practices in our PHN region to achieve and maintain accreditation under the NGPA scheme. To work with RACHs, GPs and practices, Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations (ACCHOs) and Aboriginal Medical Services (AMSs) within the SENSW region to increase the access of older people living in aged care homes to primary care services.

Description of Activity *

SENSW PHN will collaborate and engage with RACH's, ACCHOs, AMSs, GPs and practices in our region to support enrolment in GPACI and achieve grant objectives with activity which includes:

- Conducting a regional audit of RACH residents without a preferred GP registered in MyMedicare
- Working with RACH's and practices to develop processes to match aged care residents with GPs through the GPACI programme
- Establishing agreements with ACCHOs to develop culturally safe pathways with ACCHS, LHDs and community representatives.
- Working with practices to create and document scheduling / visit plans as part of their quality improvement processes as well as help practices build RACH visits into their routine GP rosters and admin scheduling.
- Establishing a regional network of general practices, GPs, ACCHS, and RACHs to identify, document, and share examples of best practice models—such as shared care arrangements, culturally safe pathways, and structured GP visit schedules. Facilitate quarterly meetings or forums to promote peer learning, foster collaboration, and strengthen capacity across participating organisations.

- Providing webinars, practice education sessions, and dedicated PHN web content—to increase awareness and understanding of GPACI and MyMedicare registration among GPs, practices, RACHs, and ACCHS, supporting uptake and improved care processes.

To increase the availability of services that enable residents of South Eastern NSW to maintain their health, thereby reducing health risk factors at a population level.

Description of Activity *

To embed a population health approach to the prevention and management of chronic conditions across South-eastern NSW, SENSW PHN will continue to commission initiatives that address three levels of risk: maintaining low risk populations; addressing rising risk populations and coordinating care for high-risk groups.

This activity focuses on commissioning preventive services to maintain low risk populations. Initiatives to address vaping, smoking and risky alcohol use among young people continued into early 2024/25, including ongoing promotion of campaign messages and school engagement activities focused on vaping and wellbeing.

SENSW PHN will commission community programs that address both social connectedness and other chronic disease risk factors such as nutrition and physical activity. Programs will be delivered across the SENSW catchment and intend to address gaps in opportunities for community connection, particularly in rural areas, while also improving health behaviours among low-risk cohorts.

Consumers will also contribute to the planning of preventive programs to be delivered across SENSW. This will occur through a consultation and co-design process intended to activate consumers and promote greater investment in preventive health at an individual and community level.

To increase the availability of services to improve management of patients with specific chronic conditions via primary care. The aim is to prevent the exacerbation of the chronic conditions, thereby reducing the number of patients who progress to becoming 'high risk.'

Description of Activity *

To embed a population health approach to the prevention and management of chronic conditions across South-eastern NSW, SENSW PHN will continue to commission initiatives that address three levels of risk: maintaining low risk populations; addressing rising risk groups and coordinating care for high-risk groups. This activity focuses on addressing the 'rising risk cohort of patients, in other words those who have multiple risk factors and chronic conditions which, if left unmanaged, could put them at risk of further exacerbation.

Services to manage chronic pain across the SENSW PHN region - a chronic pain service offering individual and group programs will be implemented across the catchment for consumers experiencing mild-moderate chronic pain. The service is intended to fill a gap in accessible, affordable allied health and multidisciplinary care for chronic pain. It is supplementary to the St Vincent's Hospital Sydney pain specialist services provided to the Southern NSW region via telehealth for more severe and complex presentations, completing the suite of services available for consumers across the spectrum of pain severity. Additionally, primary care nurses, GPs and allied health across the catchment will be supported to complete the Better Pain Management program offered through

ANZCA as an approach to improve the capability of clinicians to manage presentations of chronic pain locally.

Our Social Prescribing service links primary care patients to appropriate non-clinical community-based social supports, tailored to the preferences, needs and goals of the patient. The service is operating across the whole-of-region. This activity focuses on addressing the most vulnerable cohort of patients who have multiple social risk factors affecting their chronic conditions which, if left unmanaged, could put them at risk of further exacerbation, isolation or mental health conditions.

Shared Medical Appointment (SMA) modules in Chronic Pain and Smoking Cessation have been rolled out by general practices across the catchment area through the 2024/25 financial year. The SMA initiative provided an opportunity for general practices to trial innovative models of care. Practice-level evaluations of the project are continuing as projects wrap-up, with learnings to inform future practice improvement initiatives.

The Aboriginal population is a high-risk population with a high burden of chronic disease. Lack of cultural competency in mainstream services is a barrier to accessing the appropriate care which contributes to condition exacerbation. In 2025-26, SENSW PHN will wrap up our current phase of support for the delivery of culturally appropriate chronic disease management services by working with selected general practices on locally-led cultural competency.

To increase the availability of care coordination services for those residents of South-eastern NSW who are referred with complex conditions and/or multiple comorbidities, particularly those whose conditions are currently poorly controlled.

Description of Activity *

To embed a population health approach to the prevention and management of chronic conditions across South-eastern NSW, SENSW PHN will continue to commission initiatives that address three levels of risk: maintaining low risk populations; addressing rising risk groups and coordinating care for high-risk groups.

This activity targets the cohort of primary care patients who have one or more complex conditions, multiple comorbidities, and experience barriers to accessing care.

SENSW PHN will continue to commission care coordination services to support consumers with chronic conditions to manage their health through personalised care plans. Additional care coordination services for priority population group/s will be explored, aiming to improve access to health services for populations who may face additional access barriers.

The Care Coordination services support general practice by providing a referral pathway for GPs and are an important complement to our commissioned Social Prescribing service (refer to CF2 Addressing Rising Risk Population Groups). Patients with non-clinical

social needs can receive services via Social Prescribing, while those with complex clinical needs are more likely to receive services via Care Coordination.
