



Immunisation Quarterly Update Snapshot - Jun 2021

Key Messages: -

Analysis of the immunisation coverage data¹ of the South Eastern New South Wales Primary Health Network (SENSWPHN) catchment² indicates: -

- As of the Jun 2021 quarter, the overall annualised immunisation figures for all children in the SENSWPHN catchment was higher than NSW state and Australian national averages for all ages. However there are some key scope of improvements that can be identified: -
 - Potential to improve rates for children (includes 'Aboriginal'³ children) aged 24-<27 months across the catchment as rates for this group remain the lowest amongst all three reported age groups
 - Rates for Aboriginal children were recorded to be a bit lower than the overall rates for all children for ages of 12-<15 Months
- Comparison of the annualised immunisation coverage figures as of the Jun 2021 quarter reveals that amongst all 31 PHN catchments of Australia, SENSWPHN had: -
 - 12-<15 months age group 11th highest rates for all children and 9th highest for Aboriginal children
 - 24-<27 months age group 8th highest rates for all children and 5th highest for Aboriginal children
 - 60-<63 months age group 7th highest rates for all children and 18th highest for Aboriginal children
- At the level of smaller geographic regions (SA3s)⁴ the annualised immunisation coverage figures in the SENSWPHN catchment as of the Jun 2021 quarter reveal: -
 - 12-<15 months age group highest rates for the Snowy Mountains SA3; lowest rates for the South Coast SA3
 - 24-<27 months age group highest rates for the Snowy Mountains SA3; lowest rates for the South Coast SA3
 - 60-<63 months age group highest rates for the Snowy Mountains SA3; lowest rates for the South Coast SA3
- Notable findings from the analysis of recent trends of immunisation rates for the SA3 regions include: -
 - Relatively low rates for the South Coast SA3 within the certain age groups

³ In this report the term 'Aboriginal' respectfully refers to children identified as being Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander

¹ As of the September 2017 quarter, data is presented in this update snapshot is an annualised (rolling four quarters) report. So just as an example the September 2017 snapshot shows the total combined figures for December 2016, March 2017, June 2017 and September 2017 quarters. Snapshots prior to September 2017 show only one quarter of coverage rates

² The COORDINARE – South Eastern NSW PHN (SENSWPHN) figures are reported as per the 2 local health districts (LHDs) included in this catchment, namely the Illawarra Shoalhaven and the Southern NSW LHDs; and the 9 constituent substantial Statistical Area Level 3 regions (SA3s) of the SENSWPHN catchment. The overall SENSWPHN catchment figures are a sum total of its 2 constituent LHDs

⁴ Statistical Area Level 3 regions (SA3s) have variable proportions of their total population/area within the SENSWPHN catchment. Therefore, SA3 reporting of immunisation rates for the SENSWPHN catchment should be done with due caution. Only SA3s that have a substantial proportion (over 40%) within the SENSWPHN catchment have been included in this report.
