General practice play a pivital role in the delivery of palliative and end of life care. The care team led by the GP can provide a smooth transition from chronic disease management to treatment of advanced illness ensuring a palliative approach is maintained at end of life.

The quality of care a person receives in the last years, months and weeks of their life can directly affect the level of distress and grief associated with death and dying for the individual, their family, friends and carers.

To enhance the capacity, knowledge, and confidence of the practice's approach to end-of-life care consider using the After death audit quality improvement tool.

The de-identified audit tool provides an opportunity for the care team to review each death to evaluate patient care, determine if the care was appropriate or could have been provided differently and identify opportunities to improve care in the future.

Steps to implement a practice-wide 'systems approach'.

- 1. Contact COORDINARE South Eastern NSW PHN to access the Service Level Agreement (SLA) form to complete and sign prior to accessing the audit tool.
- 2. Define roles and responsibilities of key staff to coordinate and manage the audits.
- 3. Establish a communication process for all staff members.
- 4. *Complete the <u>FLDAC advance</u> care planning and palliative care organisational audit baseline audit.
- 5. Access electronic <u>After death</u> <u>audit survey tool</u> using a new form for each person.
- Save a copy by selecting the print icon in the top right hand corner prior to submitting to PHN.
- 7. Consider completing an after death audit for each person who dies and a formal review of deaths every three months.
