1. Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTPa) vaccine is now available to order for children born on or after 1 October 2014
2. Boostrix (dTpa) vaccine must not be given to children at 18 months of age
3. A new NSW Immunisation Schedule is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation under 'Alerts'

Summary

- A booster dose of pertussis, provided as a combination diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis (DTPa) vaccine, has been added to the National Immunisation Program (NIP) Schedule for children aged 18 months of age.
- In NSW, immunisation providers will be supplied with **INFANRIX** or **TRIPACEL** vaccines.
- Boostrix vaccine must not be used for 18 month old children.
- The Australian Childhood Immunisation Register will regard children born from 1 October 2014 as due for the booster dose of pertussis vaccine at 18 months (from April 2016) and overdue at 19 months (from May 2016).
- INFANRIX or TRIPACEL vaccines should be ordered now via the online vaccine ordering system at <https://nsw.csldirect.com.au>
